



**Addendum to your 2023
Annual Notice of Changes (ANOC),
Evidence of Coverage (EOC), and
Summary of Benefits (SB)**

This is important information describing updates to your Summit Health Medicare Advantage plan coverage. These updates are part of the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) of 2022. Please keep this information for your reference. This addendum can also be found on our website at www.yoursummithealth.com.

The Inflation Reduction Act requires changes to your cost sharing for some Part B drugs, including Part B-covered insulin, for contract year 2023. Your cost sharing for Part B drugs will not increase due to these changes.

Beginning **April 1, 2023**, certain Part B drugs may incur a lower coinsurance than what is listed in your ANOC, EOC or SB. The drugs subject to cost-share reductions, as well as the percentages of reductions, will be identified by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) and may change on a quarterly basis*.

Beginning **July 1, 2023**, insulin furnished through an item of durable medical equipment (such as an insulin pump) is subject to a copayment cap of \$35 for one-month's supply of insulin.

You are not required to take any action in response to this document, but we recommend you keep this information for future reference. If you have any questions, please call us at 844-827-2355 (TTY users should call 711). Hours are 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., Pacific Time, seven days a week from October 1 through March 31, with the exception of Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. (After March 31, your call will be handled by our automated phone system Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.)

*The IRA requires drug companies that raise their prices for certain Medicare Part B drugs faster than the rate of inflation to pay Medicare a rebate. Beneficiary coinsurance for those drugs will in turn be adjusted so coinsurance is based on the lower inflation-adjusted payment amount.

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
